Big Gulph in Northford: trails, forest roads, stream fishing

Genesee in Madison & Guilford: hike or bike to ruins of a colonial settlement.

Lake Bethany in Bethany: peaceful, scenic woods and water.

Lake Chamberlain in Bethany & Woodbridge: quiet fishing, scenic views.

Lake Hammonasset in Madison & Killingworth: scenic trails surround a beautiful lake.

Lake Saltonstall in East Haven & Branford: one of Connecticut's best kept fishing secrets with trophy bass and walleye and wheelchair accessible fishing dock. Nine miles of trails for hiking and bicycling.

Maltby Lakes in New Haven, West Haven & Orange: three lakes, forest paths, bicycling and shoreline fishing.

Pine Hills in Seymour & Woodbridge: trails, run across varied terrain and include an interpretive trail.

Sugarloaf Hills in Guilford: trails run through rich, varied forests.
