Lyme Disease Prevention

Lyme disease is the most commonly reported tick-borne disease in the United States. In 2010, more than 22,500 confirmed and 7,500 probable cases of Lyme disease were reported to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Lyme disease is passed to humans by the bite of black-legged ticks (also known as deer ticks in the eastern United States) and western black-legged ticks. While it is a good idea to take preventative measures against ticks year-round, be extra vigilant in warmer months (April-September) when ticks are most active. The CDC recommends:



- REPELLING TICKS WITH DEET OR PERMETHRIN
- FINDING AND REMOVING TICKS FROM YOUR BODY
- CHECKING ANIMALS FOR TICKS
- TICK PROOFING YOUR YARD
- DON'T ASSUME YOU'RE IMMUNE

SYMPTOMS OF LYME DISEASE INCLUDE: flu-like symptoms (fever, chills, sweats, muscle aches, fatigue, nausea and joint pain). Some patients have a rash or Bell's palsy (facial drooping). However, although a rash shaped like a bull's-eye is considered characteristic of Lyme disease, many people develop a different kind of Lyme rash or none at all.

Minutes of May 19, 2022 Meeting

A special meeting of the Representative Policy Board Nominating Committee ("Committee"), of the South Central Connecticut Regional Water Authority, took place on Thursday, May 19, 2022, via remote access. Chairman Havrda presided.

Chair Havrda called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

Chair Havrda reported that the committee's assignment is to recommend the election of officers to the Representative Policy Board (RPB) at its meeting on June 23, 2022, for the upcoming administrative year beginning July 1, 2022. He stated that the Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer have each served one year and the Chair has served for three and would to continue to serve his last and final term.

The Committee discussed RPB Bylaw requirements for officers. Officers can serve no more than three consecutive terms in the same role, with the exception of the Chair, who may serve one additional year.
